



SAT 6 HEAVENLY DISH

The origin of the "Feast of the Epiphany" is long and confusing, but trust us, there's a good reason you may sink your teeth into a miniature figurine of the Christ child in the next few days. Chef-restaurateur Richard Sandoval, Mr.

Nuevo Mexicano, is offering crown-shaped cake (known as *rosca de reyes*, or kings' cake)—actually a sweet bread made with dried fruit, nuts and honey—at two of his restaurants (Maya and Pampano) on Saturday 6. Buried somewhere inside the cake is the baby Jesus—

whoever bites the little guy wins a tamale party for ten people on February 2, valued at \$30 a head. **Rosca de Reyes.** Maya, 1191 First Ave between 64th and 65th Sts (212-585-1818); Pampano, 209 E 49th St between Second and Third Aves (212-751-4545). \$8 per cake slice.
